

## 2nd GRADE – Near and Far – Andrew Wyeth & David Hockney

### Lesson

How artists use visual relationships in paintings, drawing and photographs to show distance and space between different elements; highlight art of Andrew Wyeth & David Hockney

### Supplies

- 8.5” x 11” white construction paper
- Pencils
- Erasers
- Rulers
- Crayons, Markers or Colored Pencils

### Activities

#### Layered Winter Landscape Drawing

- Distribute one sheet of construction paper to each student
- Students to draw 3 diagonal lines on their paper in pencil – the lines should look like a backwards Z - Demonstrate on dry erase board or your own construction paper first
- Draw a large tree in the center starting on the bottom line
- Draw a medium tree on left starting on the middle line
- Draw a small tree on the right starting on the top line
- Erase the line in the body of the trees
- Color your picture to your liking

#### Horizon & Vanishing Point Drawing

- Distribute one sheet of construction paper to each student
- Use ruler and pencil to draw an X on the paper – draw a line from the upper left corner to the lower right corner, repeat from the upper right to the lower left
- Draw a horizontal line (the horizon) that intersects the center of the X (the vanishing point) on the paper
- Draw similar objects (trees, buildings, etc.) along the horizon starting at the vanishing point and ensure that the object touches the top and the bottom of the X line, continue making object larger working to the outside of the paper and always touching the top and bottom of the X
- Color your picture to your liking
